

ACS Goods Description Quick Reference Guide

Why a detailed Goods Description?

**Globally**, a compliant goods description is essential for efficient and timely processing of your shipment. Shipments with vague goods descriptions, such as ‘samples’, ‘parts’, can and will be held by customs. **EU Customs** mandates accurate, precise and non-generic goods descriptions **as they need to be able to derive the 6-digit HS code from it** - this is on line-item basis if shipment Export, transit or is destined EU.







Advice on how to create a specific & non generic goods description.

- Remember to ask yourself following questions when detailing the goods description:
- 1. **What are the goods?**
  - 2. **What are they used for or who will use them?**

For EU specific, to be able to derive the 6-digit HS code also ask the question:

- 3. **What are they made of?** Steel, Cotton, Plastic...

	Garments or Textiles	Trousers	Cotton trousers

	Spare parts	Motorcycle windscreen	Motorcycle plastic windscreen
	Fruit	Strawberries	Strawberries
